1 The census questionnaire allows for multiple race response. The "one race" category represents persons who indicated that they were of one race only.

2 "Two or more races" includes all persons who indicated they were of mixed race.

3 Persons of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

4 Data are on a place of residence basis.

5 Data are on a place of work basis.

6 Average wage and salary per job is calculated as total wage and salary disbursements divided by all full- and part-time wage and salary workers.

7 Excludes the self-employed, farm workers, the Armed Forces and unpaid family workers.

8 Taxable gross receipts are total sales less all applicable exemptions and deductions. Deductions are designed to make the gross receipts tax reach only receipts from sales to final users.

9 Annual taxable gross receipts in this table are sums of quarters and reflect period of activity. Includes taxable gross receipts plus food and medical deductions.

Note: The July 1, 2008 population estimate for New Mexico, published by the Census Bureau (2008 round of estimates) is 1,984,356. This represents an increase of 9.1% since April 1, 2000. Bureau of Business and Economic Research (BBER) analysis indicates that this growth rate is low in light of other economic and demographic indicators for the state. The BBER revised estimate of 2,080,047 for July 1, 2008 shows a 14.3% increase from April 1, 2000 to July 1, 2008.
